3. WORKSHOP

3.1 The City Council will observe and participate in a Strategic Planning/Goal Planning Workshop for FY 2026-2027

The City Council and staff participated in a facilitated strategic planning workshop to discuss community priorities, challenges, and potential goals for the upcoming fiscal year. Participants discussed the desired future direction of the City, including preserving community character, improving infrastructure, enhancing quality of life, and addressing growth-related challenges.

The Council reviewed current goals and discussed progress related to:

- **Water Conservation and Resources:** Continued focus on water sustainability, conservation efforts, and identifying measurable goals for future planning.
- **Emergency Preparedness:** Recognition of progress with the City's emergency notification system and discussion regarding improving internal processes and accessibility.

- **Walkability, Connectivity, and Parking:** Continued focus on pedestrian safety, connectivity, downtown parking solutions, and improving mobility throughout the community.
- **Community Facilities and Recreation:** Discussion of ongoing efforts related to community amenities and future opportunities.

The Council participated in a goal-setting exercise centered around the City's core values of quality of life, health and safety, sustainable economy, and relationships.

The following draft goals were discussed:

Relationships:

Improve communication and engagement with community partners, organizations, and stakeholders through consistent outreach and relationship-building efforts.

Health and Safety:

Strengthen infrastructure, pedestrian safety, and connectivity to support a safe and active community.

Quality of Life:

Identify and communicate the costs and impacts affecting quality of life and provide residents with better information regarding funding options and City services.

Sustainable Economy:

Develop a better understanding of the local economy and establish baseline information to guide future economic planning efforts.

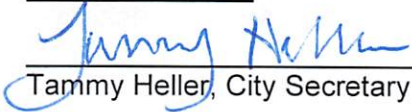
The Council discussed the importance of public communication, transparency, and educating residents regarding City operations, funding sources, and future community needs.
